

## **UConn ECE COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS IN RELATION TO COVID-19 (3.30.20)**

### **Now that schools are closed, will I lose my chance to earn UConn credits?**

As long as your high school is offering the class to you through a remote platform, you will not lose credits. This is true whether your high school instructor is offering live course instruction or recording their lectures and you are working asynchronously. There are many creative ways to offer courses online and we are working with the high schools to support instruction.

### **I have heard about a Pass/Fail option for my class, but what does that mean?**

There are no Pass/Fail options for entire classes, but student may have the ability to choose a pass/fail conversion of their grade. UConn ECE is working with the University to see how individual students could use a pass/fail designation for their UConn classes. This is an ongoing conversation and students and high schools will be updated once clear guidance is available. Regardless, UConn ECE Instructors will continue to teach the class and will grade students like usual.
